Course Registration	Students may take courses from different departments and colleges with certain restrictions.
Restrictions	The following are the restrictions students should be aware of regarding course enrollment:
	1. During the 1 <sup>st</sup> course registration period, all other majors <b>CANNOT</b> enroll in <b>business</b>
	courses and art courses. Business majors can enroll in any courses from all majors,
	except art courses. This is due to the high competition in the business department.
	2. Only art majors can enroll in art courses during all three course registration periods.
	3. Exchange students who would like to take courses in the School of Architecture and
